As an alternative, ask a speculative question and give students the opportunity to make a prediction. "What do you think you'll learn about this topic from the text you'll be reading?" Finally, have students answer the "L" (What have I learned?) question during the reading (or after they've completed it). When a reader identifies what they're learning as they read, metacognition is improved.

How are you adjusting your predictions after reading this (page, section, chapter)? What sentences parked your imagination? How do you think the character is feeling? What evidence supports your thinking? What could happen to make this character feel a different way? Which details were the most interesting to you? What questions do you have now?
